In 2017, in collaboration with Dutchess Community College, Maplebrook School, Abilities First Inc. and The Arc of Dutchess, we began "Think Ahead," a college experience program that focuses on job readiness and skills development for qualified students. In 2018, we have expanded this acclaimed program to include a summer component preparing rising second year students for interviews and internships. This job readiness certificate program has been fully embraced by DCC and local community employers, including Dutchess County Government, which has created internship opportunities for these students to build their skills and resumes.

LET'S GET MOVING Tackling Transportation Challenges Collaboratively

Reliable and accessible transportation greatly affects a person's ability to access everything our community has to offer, improves the quality of life, and preserves independence. Our Universal Transportation Accessibility Task Force works with residents, community service providers and our Division of Public Transit to address transportation needs and challenges for people of all abilities. Identifying partners who will find new solutions can result in improved customer service and alternatives to help people travel to employment, job training, education, and to activities that will support the quality of life we all enjoy. Through creative solutions and new collaborations, the availability of transportation can enhance community connections for residents to be more involved in, and connected to, their community while reducing barriers to employment and services.

Creating Accessible Parks

Dutchess County is striving to create universally accessible infrastructure. Through the County's Parks and Recreation Master Plan, we are enhancing accessibility in our parks. We have already added accessibility features to Dutchess Stadium, Bowdoin Park, and the lake at Wilcox. Next, we will move ahead with a universally accessible addition to one of our parks. As part of a public survey, the community will help select the project and the park. As we reimagine what county parks can and should be in the future, the overall priority is making them more accessible and implementing ThinkDIFFERENTLY principles to ensure all Dutchess County parks are open to everyone of every ability.

We are also working with our municipal partners and have helped identify grant opportunities for projects that improve access to facilities and resources that make Dutchess County a special place to live and raise a family.

Examples of these projects have included, the Wappinger Challenger Field, a baseball field for developmentally or physically disabled children; and Julie's Jungle, an adaptive playground for all ability levels. The ThinkDIFFERENTLY spirit also inspired projects such as Arlington High School students creating universally accessible playground equipment at Tymor Park in LaGrange. Freedom Park in LaGrange is building a sensory garden and seeking to construct an accessible fishing dock for residents to enjoy. East Fishkill's Red Wing and the County's Wilcox Park offers beach mats for easy access to and from the water, a floating beach wheelchair, and aquatic assistant swimming devices.







BUILDING INCLUSIVE COMMUNITIES

To assist in making public facilities more accessible, Dutchess County offers small capital grants to communities through our Municipal Innovation Grant Program to fund ADA improvements. Something as simple as adding a ramp or wheelchair lift to a building, ADA accessible restroom facilities, audio loop for public meetings, or accessible parking can break down barriers, making a world of difference.





DISABILITY, DREAM & DO AT DUTCHESS STADIUM

Dutchess County will sponsor and host the second annual Disability, Dream & Do Baseball Weekend at Dutchess Stadium. The camp is a collaboration between Dutchess County, the Hudson Valley Renegades, and the Dave Clark Foundation and is free for local children and young adults of all abilities. Participants learn from professional players and coaches in a great minor-league ballpark and receive a free camp T-shirt and complimentary tickets to a Renegades game at Dutchess Stadium.

Summer Games Coming to Dutchess

Dutchess County is excited to host the Special Olympics New York State Summer Games in 2019 and 2020, building on the tremendous success of the Winter Games hosted here in 2016 and 2017. These events attract thousands of athletes and coaches from around the State to compete at sports venues throughout our County. The games provide a special opportunity for the community to come together to celebrate, cheer, and be inspired by these athletes and their stories.
